

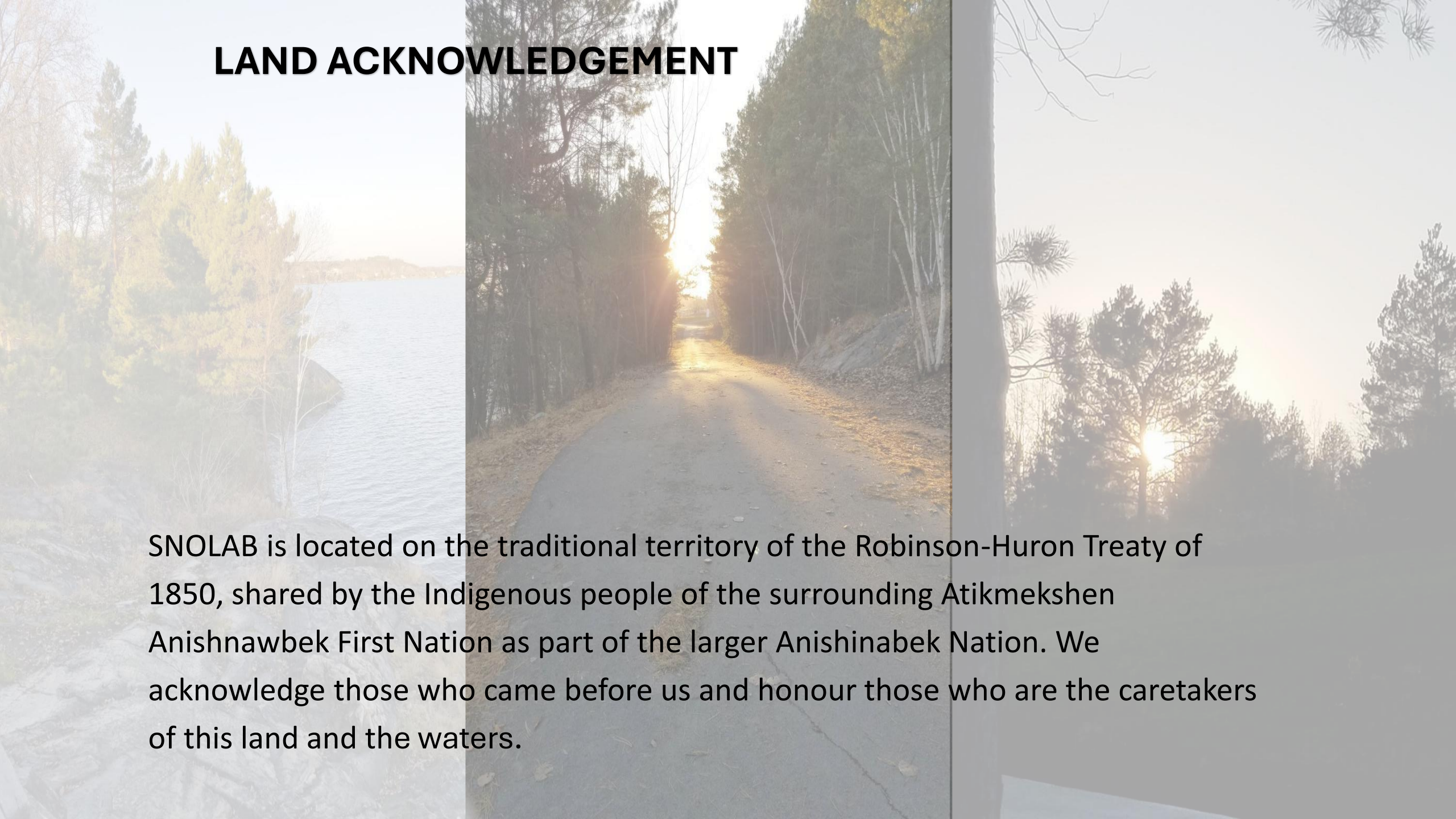

LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

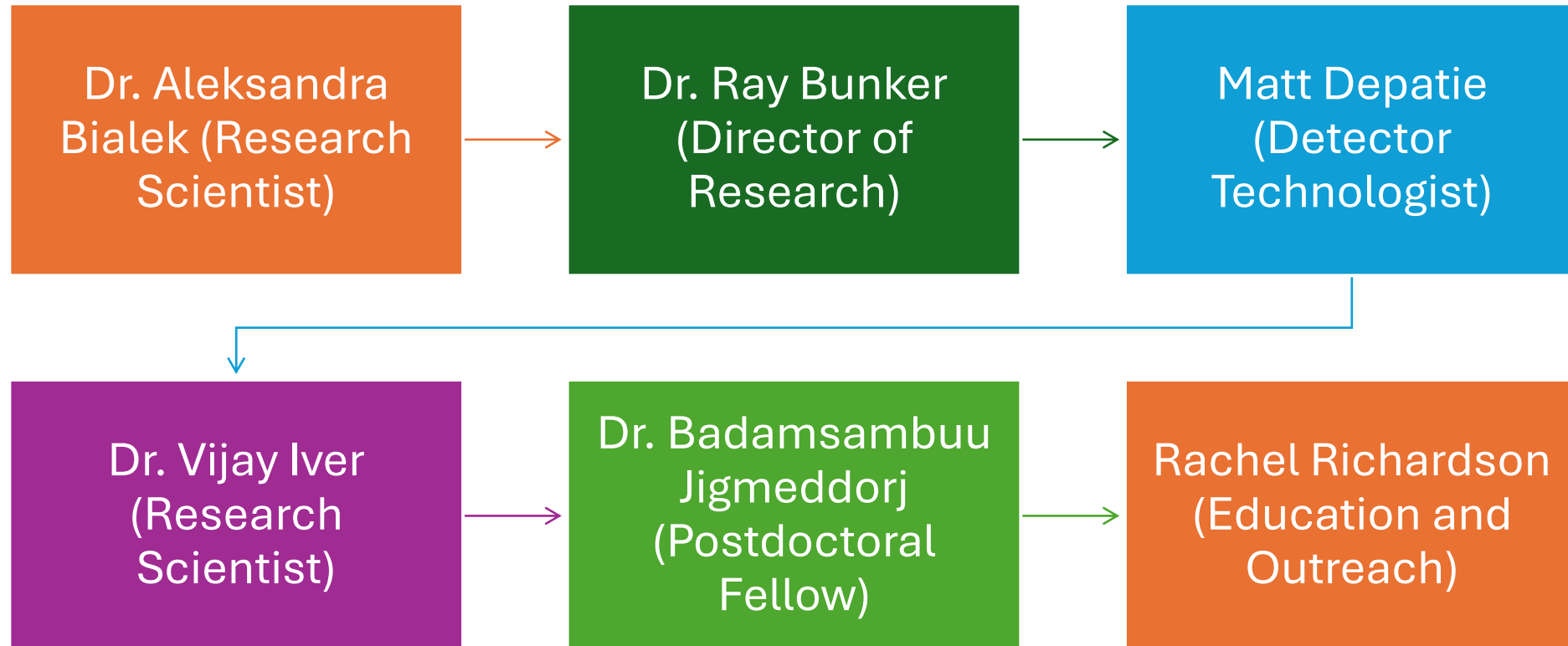

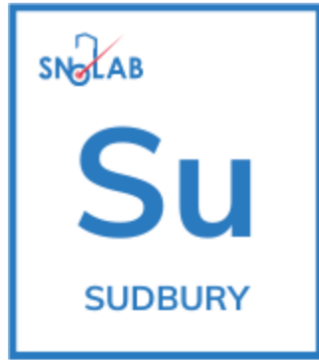

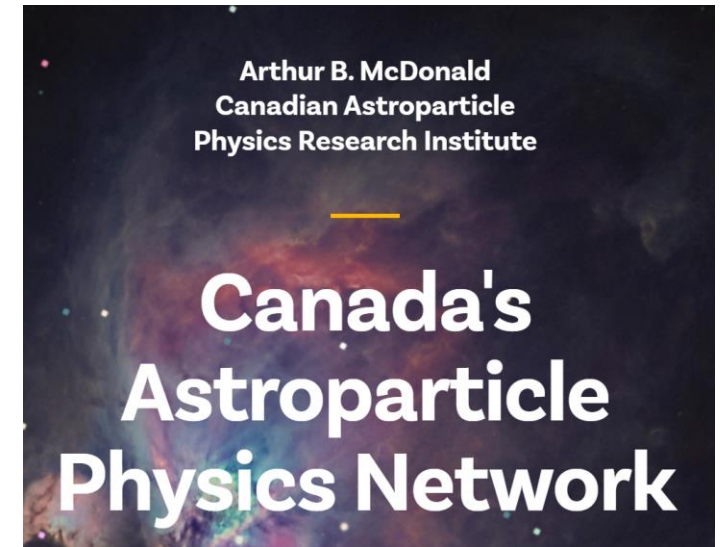
- Day 1: Introductions to E&O activity
